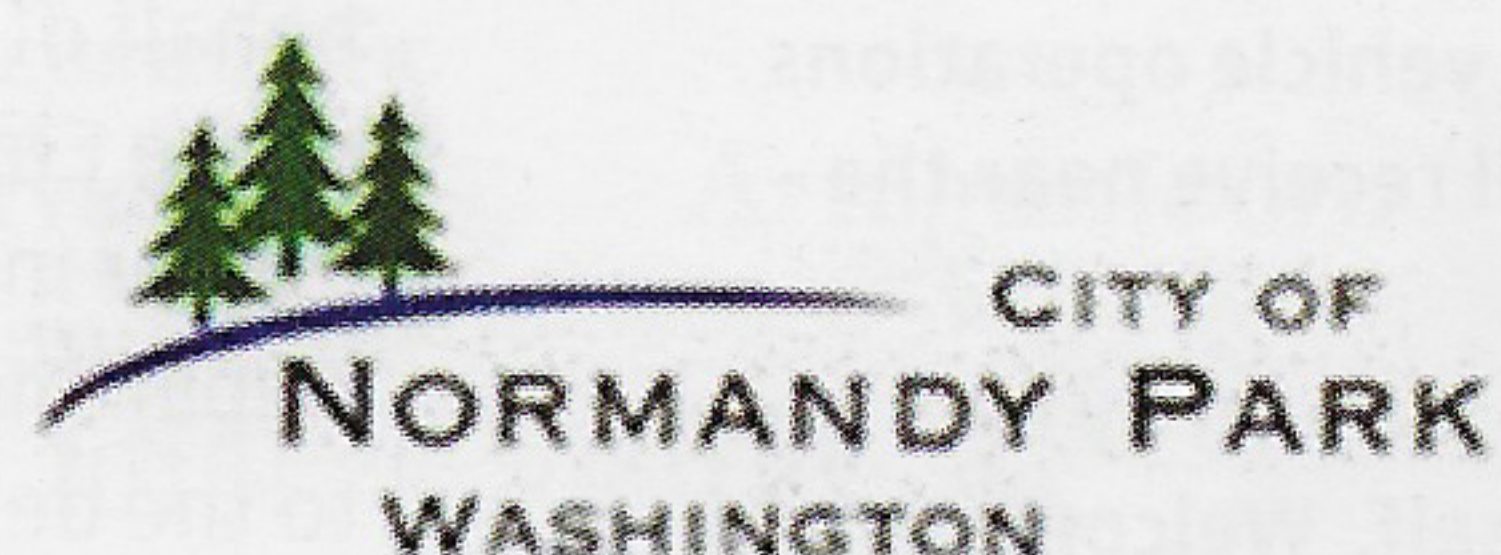

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YOU ARE HOLDING IN YOUR HANDS THE PRODUCT OF A COLLABORATIVE COMMUNITY effort between the City of Normandy Park staff and involved residents of the community—the “new” City Scene magazine.

The new *City Scene* is one of the first projects undertaken by your new Communications Committee chaired by Councilmember Susan West and constituted from concerned residents.

The Communications Committee was developed to provide a forum through which our City’s policymakers can better engage with the community they serve.

As new residents of Normandy Park, my wife Denise and I wanted to get involved in this new effort. As magazine publishers we thought helping the City produce an attractive piece to communicate with residents and promote the community was a natural way for us to give back.

City Scene is based on a model we developed for non-profit and government agencies—and private companies—to help them better communicate with their constituents ...and generate revenue.

Because the costs of the magazine are entirely underwritten by the advertising, there is no cost to the City—in fact; we plan to generate positive revenue for the community to be administered by a new non-profit foundation.

Local resident Mike Seifert has stepped up to sell advertising for the new magazine. Thanks to his efforts we are already seeing positive cash flow which will go to the foundation.

Though the primary mission of *City Scene* continues to be sharing City administrative news with residents, Normandy Park’s *City Scene* will also serve as an excellent marketing tool for local retailers looking to attract customers.

We think the take-away value of the publication will make it one of our most valuable ongoing marketing tools. Residents and visitors alike will read about local retailers, service providers and community events—all of which raise the visibility of Normandy Park –and the local businesses that keep us vibrant.

I hope you enjoy the new magazine, and I encourage you to contact me with your ideas about how we can use the magazine to promote our community.

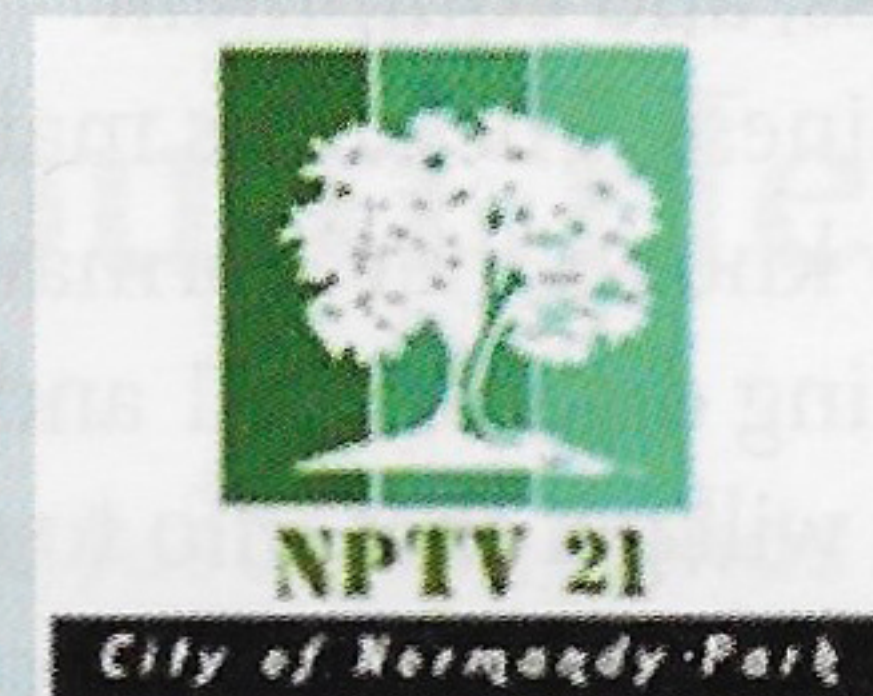
Do you have communications experience? Let me know. Together as a community, we can solve this communication dilemma.
